## WHAT THE TEST MEASURES

## Cognitive Skills

Verbal Skills (VB) assesses your child's ability of verbal reasoning skills based on his or her understanding of words.
Quantitative Skills (QT) assesses your child's ability to complete sequences, solve number sentences, compare values and analyze pictures.
Total Cognitive Skills (TCS) This is a total of the Verbal Skills and Quantitative Skills subtests.

## Basic Skills

Reading (RD) assesses your child's ability to answer questions about sounds, letters, words, and stories.
Language (LN) assesses your child's ability to answer questions about language including grammar and usage.
Mathematics (MT) assesses your child's ability in computation skills, concepts, and problem solving.
Total Basic Skills (TBS) This is a total of the Reading, Mathematics, and Language subtests.
——Other Skills and Achievements (Not included in Level 10)
Reference Skills (REF) assesses your child's ability to organize and follow directions, as well as to use reference sources and graphic materials.
Science (SC) assesses your child's understanding of important facts in biological, physical, and earth sciences, as well as the applications and nature of science.
Social Studies (SS) assesses your child's knowledge and application of the social sciences including geography, history, political science, economics, sociology and anthropology.

Battery Average (AVG) This score is an average of the subtests taken in the battery.

## WHAT THE SCORE FOR EACH TEST MEANS

National Percentile (NATL \%-ile) The scores reported above are "National Percentile Ranks." They tell what percentage of students had scores below yours in a national sample. If your Verbal Skills score is 55 , for example, this means you did better than 55 percent of the students in the national sample. A percentile rank of 50 is exactly average.

Cognitive Skills Quotient (CSQ) This score is a measure of a student's learning potential. It is an age-based norm rather than gradebased. Your CSQ score is 109.

Grade Scores (GS) Grade Scores place performance on a scale by grade and time of year. You can tell whether your child scored above or below the national average by comparing the grade score for any subtest with the base grade/time of year. Scores above the base are above average. Please keep in mind all results are based on the current grade material. The base grade/time of year GS for this group is 09.8 .
